

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Directed Learning

WCHS is entering its 4th year of the Alberta Education High School Redesign Initiative. Our focus within this initiative remains on high school completion. At WCHS, one of our key strategies is to incorporate time within the school day where students can receive extra support or have choice on how they will use instructional time to further their studies. We call this concept Directed Learning.

Directed Learning is focused on providing students additional time and support who are not currently achieving academic success in their core classes. Directed Learning is scheduled on Tuesdays and Thursdays and will take place after Block 1. Directed Learning can be easily described as being:

- 1. <u>Student Directed</u>: Students who are succeeding academically will have a choice.
- 2. <u>Teacher Directed</u>: Students who are <u>At Risk</u> of not being successful in a core class will be locked in and provided extra help.

Starting next week students in Grades 10 - 12 will be using their Maplewood Logins to sign up for a directed learning session or to see what directed learning session they are required to attend. In Grade 9, students will be locked into required sessions for quarter one. Our focus in Grade 9 will be to ensure our students receive the proper support, guidance, and orientation to be successful at WCHS.


Starting next week, ask your child what they are doing in directed learning? As a school we see the impact that this time can have on all our students' academic success.

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Biology 20 Field Study - X-Stream Science Thursday, September 27th


Biology 20 students will be participating in the Battle River Watershed Alliance's (BRWA) X-Stream Science Program.

X-Stream Science is an inquiry- based learning opportunity lead by local experts to connect students to their watershed through real world science. Students will be travelling to Coal Lake where they will collect biological, chemical and physical data on the water and surrounding land. Water quality, quantity and land use data is collected, analyzed and stored to be monitored and compared over time. This data will help students and decision makers make good choices to help our watersheds.

Dear Parents:

Re: Fair Notice

The safety of our children is a top priority for us all. We, as a school system, have been involved in intensive safety training with our community partners - the police, Mental Health and Child and Family Authority. Together we have developed a plan for responding to all situations in which students may be posing a threat to themselves or others.

This letter is to inform you that we, as a school system, now have a policy that requires principals to complete a "risk assessment" in all cases of students making significant threats to harm themselves or others. The purpose of the assessment is to determine the level of risk the student poses, and how best to support high-risk students so that their behavior does not become hurtful or destructive. In all cases where staff know that a student has behaved in a threatening way please be assured that your principal will be taking measures to deal with the situation in a positive and proactive manner. If your principal invites you to a meeting to discuss safety concerns about your own child, please understand that policy is being followed and that the goal is safety, not punishment.

This letter is intended to serve our community with fair notice that we, as a school community, will not accept "no response" to a serious threat or high-risk behavior. Our goal is to respond to all high-risk situations in a professional manner that provides for a healthy and caring learning environment.

We are proud to be able to provide this level of support to our school communities and are most fortunate to have our community partners at our side.
