

School Equity Program

Are you interested in post-secondary schooling but aren't sure what you'd like to take or where you'd like to go? Do you have questions you'd like answered before you send in your application? Luckily for you, representatives from up to 28 different post-secondary institutions from across Alberta will be converging on WCHS to answer your questions! Join us Tuesday, November 20th from 7 to 8:30 pm in the Cafeteria and Atrium to get the information you need!

Co-op School Equity Program

We want to invite the Wetaskiwin Regional Public Schools' families to participate in the Wetaskiwin Co-op School Equity Program, which will allow schools to earn equity on both educational and personal purchases. Liquor and purchases under personal charge accounts are not eligible. Each participating school will be assigned a membership number at no charge and at the till, customers at all Wetaskiwin Co-op locations will have the option to use a school membership number. The equity earned from each of these purchases will be calculated based on Wetaskiwin Co-op's fiscal year, November 1st – October 31st and 100% of the equity earned will be paid out to the school in early January.

This type of fundraising initiative allows for greater donations back to the school and allows all schools to participate equally. For instance, if a school with 700 student had \$1000 of purchases per family for a total of \$700,000 in purchases that school would receive \$14,000 cash back based on a 2% equity allocation. With the implementation of this program, the expectation is that both parties would participate in marketing and execution of this plan and any extra sponsorship requests from the schools will not be considered.

A Message from Coach Gibson


The Sabres Football Team's 2018 season started with their annual spring camp that was highlighted by an exhibition game with Beaumont HS in early June. The fall camp began on August 23rd and a core of about 20 players showed their dedication to the team with solid performances in exhibition games against Leduc Comp and Willow Creek (Claresholm). While both exhibition games were losses, the team learned a great deal that helped with greater success later in the season.

Regular season saw an opening game tie with Camrose, a loss to Ponoka, a win over Rocky Mountain House followed by another learning-about-ourselves loss to Stettler. A win over Drayton Valley meant that the Sabres were guaranteed a spot in fourth place of the A side playoffs. The final season game was against Sylvan Lake, a tough last minute defeat. In the first round of playoffs the Sabres lost a close game to eventual league champs from Stettler. The season finished with the Sabres beating Ponoka in the third place game - a very successful way to finish a season of team work.

Sabres players who received recognition with league awards were Josh Wiebe as Rookie of the year and All Stars Lucas Bishop, Nathan Wiebe, Layden Armsden, Evan Roth, Jake Emmerling and Hayden Mimnagh.

The Sabres wrap up banquet is on November 29 and will feature team awards that are voted upon by the players, as well as a moment to thank our graduating players.

Snow and icy conditions today serve as a great reminder about the Wetaskiwin Regional Public Schools Bus Status app, that is available for free for iPhone and Android mobile devices.

Enjoy the faster and more personalized version of our Bus Status App. Access through the Web, iPhone, and Android.

Push notification system, lets you know about delays and cancellations when they are posted.

WRPS information screen allows you to access inclement weather policies, contact information and general regulations with just a tap.

Important: Users must "star" buses you wish to receive push notifications for once they have upgraded.

The bus app is created by Box Clever, an Edmonton-based web design company, and information on Wetaskiwin Regional Public Schools routes is updated by the Transportation Manager.
