iv. Administrator's (Kris Denney)

- 1. School Results
 - Accountability Pillar Summary things have changed in the way that the data was collected.
 - Previously ALL student answers from the <u>Tell It From</u> Me survey were used
 - This year only grade 10 student answers were used
 - ➤ Safe and Caring: has dropped the students and teachers numbers remained about the same but the parents survey dropped 15%
 - Will be sending out a survey to all students and parents to help ascertain the reasons for the drop
 - Program of Studies: Parents seem to have a better understanding of what is available for students to take
 - > Drop out Rate: we are about the same as the Alberta rate
 - ➤ High School Completion: goal is raise the average by 10%
 - We are 10% behind provincial average
 - FNMI is even lower
 - > PAT: Increased 3% last year but it was not what we were hoping for
 - We scored well in everything but math same as the rest of the Province
 - Diplomas: Scored well in diplomas (above the Province)
 - ➤ Work Preparation: It is up from last year but still 12% below Provincial average
 - Would like to dig into this and see why this is the case

- ➤ Completion Rate increased by 10%
- ➤ PAT 10% increase in acceptable rate, 5% in excellence
- ➤ Diplomas 10% increase in acceptable, 5% in excellence
