A. School Board Representative - Lynn Ware

- The Educational Budget 2023 is out. Feb. 28 a letter from the Minister explaining goals. There is a lot of money allocated to classroom and mental health support. This budget will go in effect for September 1, 2024.

Q:Violetta: When is the budget for?

A:Lynn: The Budget takes effect September 1, 2024 - not the upcoming school year, but for 2024/2025 Academic Year

Q:Violetta: RAP Program questions: Is the RAP Program more geared for Gr. 11/12 students? Is it possible to apply for it as a Gr.10 student? She did get some information about it and it mentioned they would consider gr.10 students. Please clarify.

A: Mr. Willmott: Yes, they can apply for it as a Gr. 10 student. The school encourages the Gr.11/12 students to apply first. In some cases the Gr. 10 students worked so much they finished all the required hours by the end of grade 11. It is better to finish that in Grade 12, and then go on to NAIT and get evaluated. If it is completed too early, the student might lose some of the knowledge waiting to go to NAIT. However, if a Gr. 10 student starts the program, they should aim to finish at the end of grade 12.

Q: Violetta: How many hours are required?

A: Mr. Willmott: Depends on the program. Example: Welding 1600 hours. There are different stages of apprenticeship - work - go to NAIT/SAIT - work again Work experience is different from the RAP Program - get up to 15 credits (every 25hours). It can be both volunteering or paid - students working at different jobs.
